Grant Agreement with Newly Started REV UP Voting Coalitions

This document serves as a Grant Agreement between the American Association of People with Disabilities (AAPD), located at 2020 Pennsylvania Ave., Mailbox 263, Washington DC 20006 and [insert REV UP Coalition Name], the Grantee, located at [insert REV UP Coalition Address]. Purpose of Grant:

The REV UP network is composed of state and local coalitions that work to advance the Disability Vote. REV UP's mission is to foster civic engagement and protect the voting rights of Americans with disabilities. Each REV UP Voting Coalition is critical to mobilizing and activating the power of the Disability Vote in their state. Since Coalitions are composed of volunteers and representatives from organizations, funding can be a critical missing component at the start of a REV UP Coalition. In our goal to expand REV UP Voting Coalitions across the United States, AAPD REV UP offers this grant to fund the following general expenses of [insert REV UP Coalition Name] during their first year of operating.

Possible Grant Activities:

- Providing ASL interpreting and CART captioning for your REV UP calls and events.
- Securing other technology, such as video call software, for REV UP calls and events.
- Creating a professional website for your REV UP coalition.
- Conducting a postcard or phone-banking campaign.
- Hosting voter education and information sessions, as well as trainings on the rights of voters with disabilities.
- Getting voting outreach materials translated into Spanish or plain language for your communities.
- Purchasing advertising spots on your local radio or news stations with messages about the disability vote.

- Renting tables, chairs, and tents for voter registration drives.
- Paying venue and event production costs.
- Inviting and compensating speakers for REV UP events.
- Other costs associated with operating a REV UP Voting Coalition and conducting voter outreach.

Please note that these possible grant activities are not all required to receive a grant. You may also apply to use the grant for other activities not listed that would grow your REV UP coalition or grow the power of the disability vote in your community.

Reporting Requirements:

By the end of the sixth month of the grant term, Grantee will provide a midterm written report including analytics to the material/activities that promoted the Disability Vote and an accounting of the budget. The Grantee will provide a final report with the same information as the midterm report by the end of the full grant term. Some reporting data may include social media engagement, numbers of contacts reached with voting material, number and types of events held, and more.

Please note that new REV UP coalitions receiving or applying for the REV UP Start Up Grant may also apply for the REV UP Voting Outreach Grant.
