



HOW TO VOTE IN MICHIGAN

A Quick Guide for People with Disabilities Voting in the 2022 General Election on or Before November 8, 2022.



REGISTERING TO VOTE

- **How can I register to vote?** You can register:
 - If you have already registered, you can check if you are registered to vote at vote411.org.
 - Online at Michigan's [Online Voter Registration Website](#).
 - By downloading and mailing the Michigan [mail in registration form](#).
- **When do I need to register?** Be sure to register to vote on or before October 24, 2022, or you can register in person on Election Day.
- **Do I need identification (ID) to register?** You will need to have a Michigan address and Michigan state ID card or driver's license. You can use your social security number if you don't have a state ID.
- **Can I vote if I have a disability?** Yes! People with disabilities who are 18 years old or older have the right to vote. Your vote matters and is protected by laws to make sure voting is accessible, independent, and private. If you have a guardian, you can still vote. For help understanding or getting back your right to vote, contact your local [Protection and Advocacy Agency \(P&A\)](#).
- **Can I vote if I have gone to jail or prison?** If you have gone to jail or prison, you should check to see if you are allowed to vote. Learn about

LEARNING ABOUT THE ISSUES

- **What is a ballot?** A ballot is a list of who and what you can vote for. Your ballot will list candidates who are running for different offices, such as Senator or Representative. You vote by marking your choice on the ballot.
- **What is a ballot measure?** Sometimes, your ballot will have ballot measures. A ballot measure is a law, issue, or question that you can vote on. Voters get to decide if they agree or disagree with the ballot measure by voting yes to agree or no to disagree. You can learn about ballot measures on the Michigan [election website](#).
- **Can I look at my ballot before I go to vote?** Enter your home address in [Ballotpedia's Sample Ballot Lookup](#). This tool will give you a "sample ballot," which will show you what will be on your ballot when you vote.



VOTING IN PERSON

- **Where do I need to go to vote?** The place where you go to vote in person is called a polling place. You can find your local polling place through the Michigan election website. [Find your polling place](#).
- **Can I vote before Election Day?** You can vote early in person at your township clerk's office before Election Day. Michigan calls this period the "In-Person Absentee Voting Period." You may vote at your city or township clerk's office between September 29, 2022 and November 7, 2022 to avoid lines on Election Day! [What is In-Person Absentee Voting?](#)

- **Can I vote outside if the polling place is inaccessible?** Yes, Michigan does allow voters to vote outside the polling place if it is inaccessible. This is called curbside voting.
- **What if I want help with filling out my ballot?** You may choose someone to help you vote. Your helper cannot be a candidate or your boss. If you are part of a labor union at work, the person who helps you vote cannot be a representative of that labor union. [What is a labor union?](#) You may also ask for help from poll workers at the polling place.
- **Do I need an ID?** In Michigan, voter must bring photo ID to vote. If you don't have photo ID, you can sign a statement called an affidavit to vote. [What is an affidavit?](#) [Learn about voter ID.](#)



VOTING BY MAIL

- **Can I vote by mail?** Any voter in Michigan can vote by mail.
- **How do I request a mail ballot?** You must request your ballot online, in person, or by mail, fax, or email. [Request your ballot.](#)
- **Can I get an electronic absentee ballot?** Michigan allows voters who are blind, have low vision, have a physical disability, or have a learning disability that makes it difficult to read or mark a paper ballot to request an accessible electronic absentee voter ballot. Voters can electronically fill out this ballot, print it, and return it. [Request electronic ballot.](#)
- **When do I need to request my ballot?** The last day to request a mail ballot online or by mail, fax, or email is November 4, 2022. The last day to request a mail ballot in person is November 7, 2022.
- **Do I need to sign my ballot?** Be sure to sign your ballot or envelope when asked, since Michigan requires this signature to match one of your past signatures.
- **What if I want help with filling out my ballot?** You should be allowed to choose someone to help you with filling out your ballot. Someone helping you must sign your ballot return envelope.

- **How do I return my ballot?** You can return your ballot by mail or deliver it to a local clerk's office or drop box. Your ballot must be received by election officials by 8 p.m. on November 8, 2022.
- **Can someone return my ballot for me?** You may have a family member or someone who lives with you return your ballot for you.
- **Do I need an ID to vote by mail?** No, you do not need an ID when voting by mail unless you are voting for the first time in a federal election in Michigan.
- **Can I track my ballot?** Yes, you can track your ballot online to see if the elections office has received it. You can do this on the Michigan election website. [Track your ballot.](#)
