



HOW TO VOTE IN TENNESSEE

A Quick Guide for People with Disabilities Voting in the 2022 General Election on or Before November 8, 2022.



REGISTERING TO VOTE

- **How can I register to vote?** You can register:
 - If you have already registered, you can check if you are registered to vote at vote411.org.
 - Online at Tennessee's [Online Voter Registration Website](#).
 - By downloading and mailing the Tennessee [mail in registration form](#).
- **When do I need to register?** Be sure to register to vote on or before October 11, 2022. Tennessee does not allow people to register after this date or on Election Day for this election.
- **Do I need identification (ID) to register?** You will need to have a Tennessee address and your social security number to register to vote.
- **Can I vote if I have a disability?** Yes! People with disabilities who are 18 years old or older have the right to vote. Your vote matters and is protected by laws to make sure voting is accessible, independent, and private. If you have a guardian, it is likely that you are not allowed to vote, but may be able to get your right to vote back. - **Can I vote if I have gone to jail or prison?** If you have gone to jail or prison, you should check to see if you are allowed to vote. Learn about voting rights for people who have [gone to jail or prison](#). You can also [contact your local P&A](#).



LEARNING ABOUT THE ISSUES

- **What is a ballot?** A ballot is a list of who and what you can vote for. Your ballot will list candidates who are running for different offices, such as Senator or Representative. You vote by marking your choice on the ballot.
- **What is a ballot measure?** Sometimes, your ballot will have ballot measures. A ballot measure is a law, issue, or question that you can vote on. Voters get to decide if they agree or disagree with the ballot measure by voting yes to agree or no to disagree. You can learn about ballot measures on the Tennessee [election website](#).
- **Can I look at my ballot before I go to vote?** Enter your home address in [Ballotpedia's Sample Ballot Lookup](#). This tool will give you a "sample ballot," which will show you what will be on your ballot when you vote.



VOTING IN PERSON

- **Where do I need to go to vote?** The place where you go to vote in person is called a polling location. You can find your local polling location through the Tennessee election website. [Find your polling location](#).
- **Can I vote before Election Day?** Tennessee allows any voter to vote in person before Election Day during the Early Voting period. You can vote between October 17, 2022 and November 7, 2022 and avoid lines on Election Day!

- **Can I vote outside if the polling place is inaccessible?** No, Tennessee does not allow voters to vote outside the polling location if it is inaccessible.
- **What if I want help with filling out my ballot?** You may choose someone to help you vote. Your helper cannot be a candidate or your boss. If you are part of a labor union at work, the person who helps you vote cannot be a representative of that labor union. [What is a labor union?](#) You may also ask for help from poll workers at the polling location. You and your helper must sign a form which says that you need help and that your helper will assist you with voting.
- **Do I need an ID?** Tennessee requires voters to show photo ID to vote in person. [Learn about voter ID.](#)



VOTING BY MAIL

- **Can I vote by mail?** If you have a disability or you are away from home on Election Day, you may vote by mail in Tennessee. This is called voting absentee by mail. [What is absentee voting?](#)
- **How do I request a mail ballot?** You must apply for an absentee ballot through your county election office by mail, fax, or email. [Request your ballot.](#)
- **Can I get an electronic absentee ballot?** Tennessee allows voters who are blind, have low vision, have a physical disability, or have a learning disability that makes it difficult to read or mark a paper ballot to request an emailed or faxed ballot. They can fill out the ballot electronically, print it, and return it. [Request electronic ballot.](#)
- **When do I need to request my ballot?** The last day to request your ballot is November 1, 2022. Request your ballot as soon as possible to make sure that you receive your ballot on time.

- **Do I need to sign my ballot?** Be sure to sign your ballot or envelope when asked, since Tennessee requires this signature to match one of your past signatures.
- **What if I want help with filling out my ballot?** You should be allowed to choose someone to help you with filling out your ballot. If you need help filling out your ballot, you must have a witness watch as your helper marks your ballot. Both the person who is helping the voter and the witness must sign a statement.
- **How do I return my ballot?** You can return your ballot by mail or in person. Your ballot must be received by election officials before the polls close on November 8, 2022.
- **Can someone return my ballot for me?** No, only the voter may return their ballot to the election office.
- **Do I need an ID to vote by mail?** No, you do not need an ID when voting an absentee ballot by mail unless you are voting for the first time in a federal election in Tennessee.
- **Can I track my ballot?** Yes, you can track your ballot online to see if the elections office has received it. You can do this on the Tennessee election website. [Track your ballot.](#)
