



HOW TO VOTE IN VIRGINIA

A Quick Guide for People with Disabilities Voting in the 2022 General Election on or Before November 8, 2022.



REGISTERING TO VOTE

- **How can I register to vote?** You can register:
 - If you have already registered, you can check if you are registered to vote at vote411.org.
 - Online at Virginia's [Online Voter Registration Website](#).
 - By downloading and mailing the Virginia [mail in registration form](#).
- **When do I need to register?** You can register to vote up to election day, November 8. Virginia now allows voters to register before and on election day. [Learn more about same-day voter registration](#).
- **Do I need identification (ID) to register?** You will need to have a Virginia address and a social security number to register to vote.
- **Can I vote if I have a disability?** Yes! People with disabilities who are 18 years old or older have the right to vote. Your vote matters and is protected by laws to make sure voting is accessible, independent, and private. If you have a guardian, it is likely that you are not allowed to vote unless a judge says otherwise, but you may be able to get your right to vote back. - **Can I vote if I have gone to jail or prison?** If you have gone to jail or prison, you should check to see if you are allowed to vote. Learn about

voting rights for people who have [gone to jail or prison](#). You can also [contact your local P&A](#).



LEARNING ABOUT THE ISSUES

- **What is a ballot?** A ballot is a list of who and what you can vote for. Your ballot will list candidates who are running for different offices, such as Senator or Representative. You vote by marking your choice on the ballot.
- **What is a ballot measure?** Sometimes, your ballot will have ballot measures. A ballot measure is a law, issue, or question that you can vote on. Voters get to decide if they agree or disagree with the ballot measure by voting yes to agree or no to disagree. You can learn about ballot measures on the Virginia [election website](#).
- **Can I look at my ballot before I go to vote?** Enter your home address in [Ballotpedia's Sample Ballot Lookup](#). This tool will give you a "sample ballot," which will show you what will be on your ballot when you vote.



VOTING IN PERSON

- **Where do I need to go to vote?** The place where you go to vote in person is called a polling place. You can find your local polling place through the Virginia election website. [Find your polling place](#).
- **Can I vote before Election Day?** Virginia allows any voter to vote in person before Election Day during the Early Voting period. You can vote between October 24, 2022 and November 5, 2022 and avoid lines on Election Day!
- **Can I vote outside if the polling place is inaccessible?** Yes, Virginia does allow voters to vote outside the polling place if it is inaccessible. This is called curbside voting.
- **What if I want help with filling out my ballot?** You may choose someone to help you vote. Your helper cannot be a candidate or your

boss. If you are part of a labor union at work, the person who helps you vote cannot be a representative of that labor union. [What is a labor union?](#) You may also ask for help from poll workers at the polling place.

- **Do I need an ID?** Virginia requires voters to show a valid form of ID to vote. If a voter doesn't have an ID, they can sign a form called an ID Confirmation Statement to vote. [Learn about voter ID.](#)



VOTING BY MAIL

- **Can I vote by mail?** Any voter in Virginia can vote by mail. This is called absentee voting. [What is absentee voting?](#)
- **How do I request a mail ballot?** You must apply for an absentee ballot online or through your local election office. [Request your ballot.](#)
- **Can I get an electronic absentee ballot?** Virginia allows voters who are blind, have low vision, have a physical disability, or have a learning disability that makes it difficult to read or mark a paper ballot to request an electronic absentee ballot. They can fill out the ballot electronically, print it, and return it. [Request electronic ballot.](#)
- **When do I need to request my ballot?** The last day to request your ballot is October 28, 2022. Request your ballot as soon as possible to make sure that you receive your ballot on time.
- **Do I need to sign my ballot?** Be sure to sign your ballot or envelope when asked, since Virginia requires this signature to match one of your past signatures. You must also have a witness sign your ballot envelope when asked.
- **What if I want help with filling out my ballot?** You should be allowed to choose someone to help you with filling out your ballot. You must ask for help on the absentee ballot application. Someone helping you may need to complete a statement called an affidavit to be returned with the paper ballot. [What is an affidavit?](#)

- **How do I return my ballot?** You can return your ballot by mail, in person, or by drop box. If you are returning your ballot by mail, it must be postmarked by November 8, 2022, and received by election officials by 12 p.m. on November 11, 2022. If you are returning your ballot in person or to a drop box, it must be received by 7 p.m. on November 8, 2022.
- **Can someone return my ballot for me?** You may choose to have someone mail your ballot or deliver it to a drop box. Only the voter can deliver their ballot to an election office.
- **Do I need an ID to vote by mail?** No, you do not need an ID when voting an absentee ballot by mail unless you are voting for the first time in a federal election in Virginia.
- **Can I track my ballot?** Yes, you can track your ballot online to see if the elections office has received it. You can do this on the Virginia election website. [Track your ballot.](#)
