The HELP Committee works on a wide range of issues in the areas of health, education, labor, disability, pensions, and oversight. Interest and experience in disability-related matters, including but not limited to: the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Rehabilitation Act, the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, Administration for Community Living, Office of Disability Employment Policy, school discipline, accessibility, home and community-based services, and civil rights issues.
